A PUBLIC HEALTH VICTORY

In 2021, over fifty combined-sewer overflow events released over 125 million gallons of sewage into the Lower Basin of the Charles River. With upwards of thirty-five inches of heavy summertime precipitation, our current wastewater system's fragility came to light: residents of our watershed were unjustly exposed to pollutant-laden water carrying bacteria, excess nutrients, pharmaceuticals, and even harmful PFAS compounds.

Without your support, the public might never have known about these polluted discharges. In January, Governor Charlie Baker signed a landmark bill requiring prompt, timely public notification of all combined sewage discharges into our waterbodies. We believe once the public realizes the frequency of these discharges, there will be greater pressure to end them.

Your partnership will leverage this increased transparency to lobby for the investments necessary to end these sewage releases once and for all.

RESTORING A CLEAN, FREE-FLOWING CHARLES RIVER

We are making real progress to remove failing, defunct mill dams and restore a free-flowing, resilient Charles River. Today, nineteen dams interrupt our river, impeding migratory fish passage, harming the river ecosystem, upholding the legacy of colonization and dispossession of Indigenous nations, and, in some cases, reducing the climate resilience of our river.

Your investments have created momentum for dam removal. Specifically, feasibility studies were completed for both Wrentham Eagle Dam and Watertown Dam, and the Town of Natick kicked off discussions for removing the Charles River Dam at South Natick. From public education events to press interviews; from site-visits and one-on-one meetings with community, state, and local leaders to a longform persuasive report on dam removal—your gifts are having a transformational impact for our river to achieve our collective vision for a free-flowing, restored, climate-resilient Charles for future generations.

ASSESSING THE HEALTH OF OUR WETLANDS

The Charles River Natural Valley Storage Area (NVSA) is a network of 8,100 acres of preserved wetlands that provides significant flood mitigation for Boston and other downstream cities and towns. With your support, along with a grant from the Massachusetts Environmental Trust, we conducted stream health assessments including a survey of fish populations, habitat assessments, and river bug sampling. We found that Dix Brook, a tributary of Mine Brook and the Charles River, is degraded and that the overall area is threatened by the many effects of development such as invasive species growth, loss of biodiversity, reduced riparian habitat, low streamflow, and poor water quality. Our work focused on an especially vulnerable priority area in the Town of Franklin and confirmed action is needed to rehabilitate coldwater fish populations, mitigate stormwater pollution, improve water quality, and restore biodiversity.

Thanks to your partnership, residents in Boston and other downstream communities will be better protected from flooding as NVSA health improves.

GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE FOR MILFORD

Many of the ecological troubles in the Charles River can be traced back to the disruption of the natural water cycle as we have expanded our built environment: roads, buildings, sidewalks and other impermeable surfaces. That's why nature-based solutions are so important!

This year, your gifts are at work installing green infrastructure in Milford. By the end of summer 2022, you will find two beautiful new rain gardens in Milford Town Park. An underground infiltration chamber is also being installed, which is an unseen but essential part of this nature-based solution. It will reduce 25 pounds of nutrient pollution load into the Charles River, provide over 160,000 gallons of groundwater recharge, and help Milford meet required pollution reductions. These nature-based solutions will boost Milford's ecological resilience, especially in regard to drought and flood damage. By helping to eliminate significant phosphorus pollution, Milford Town Park will be drastically improved for the community, wildlife, and watershed as a whole. We're especially excited for the project's extensive multilingual outreach, as Milford has multiple Environmental Justice neighborhoods and climate-vulnerable residents. Providing opportunities for all residents to engage meaningfully and conveniently echoes our vision for equal access to our community's natural resources.

FORMING CONNECTIONS WITH WATER QUALITY DATA

CRWA has long kept tabs on water quality, but this year, with your support, **this data is even more relevant and accessible with the launch of the E. coli Dashboard.** It's a live interactive map, accessible on our website, that reveals E. coli trends across the watershed. Created in collaboration with Code for Boston, the E. coli Dashboard brings data to life. **It greatly improves the accessibility of our crucial data so everyone in our community is equipped to make informed decisions when getting onto the water.**

Additionally, your generosity allowed us to expand outreach for our Flagging Program—the only resource alerting boaters, rowers, swimmers, kayakers, and paddlers alike to take precautions on the river. This live notification system indicates if the river's water quality meets the boating safety standard. It uses color-coded flags posted at twelve participating boathouses between Watertown and Boston, daily email notifications, and a Flagging Twitter bot!

TOGETHER, WE ARE BUILDING RESILIENCE IN THE WATERSHED

Climate change isn't coming—it's here. Increased precipitation, extreme weather, blistering heat waves... the tangible effects of warming are already happening in Massachusetts, and our highly urbanized watershed and all of us who call it home are increasingly vulnerable. Compounding social factors such as poverty or isolation can lead to catastrophic outcomes and must be addressed in tandem with these environmental challenges.

Together, we are stepping up to this challenge—in partnership with nearly two dozen of our watershed communities—with the launch of the Charles River Flood Model.

This watershed-scale flood visualization shows how increased precipitation and inland flooding will affect our communities, identifying critical facilities and neighborhoods at risk. This essential resource will be of help selecting priority flood

mitigation interventions, influencing local and state policy and legislation, and empowering cities, towns, and residents alike to join together to adapt to climate change.
